

Recommendation for Lindsay Jagodowski

It is a pleasure to write a recommendation for Lindsay Jagodowski who has been a flexible, highly valued employee at Derby for the past three years. Lindsay completed her internship at Phillips Exeter in 2009 and was anxious to find a way to gain more classroom experience at a time when teaching positions were very hard to find. We were looking for a substitute teacher who would be on site each day to cover classes across the grades and disciplines.
